

Washington Junior Football League Inc. Photo I.D. Policy

Since the 2006 season the Four Rivers Youth Football League of which WJFL is a member has mandated that all participants must produce a state issued photo I.D. as proof of age before all league games as stated in Article IV Section 1 of the league By-Laws listed below.

Article IV Players

Section 1. In order to participate on or against teams in the 5th grade division, a player may not have reached 12 years of age prior to July 1 preceding the opening of the current season.

In order to participate on or against teams in the 6^{th} grade division, a player may not have reached 13 years of age prior to July 1 preceding the opening of the current season.

In order to participate on or against teams in the 7th grade division, a player may not have reached 14 years of age prior to July 1 preceding the opening of the current season.

In order to participate on or against teams in the 8th grade division, a player may not have reached 15 years of age prior to July 1 preceding the opening of the current season.

A state issued photo I.D .must be available at the playing field on request by the opposing coach or town representative.

These I.D.'s must be acquired at the Missouri Department of Revenue (License Bureau). The Washington License Bureau requests that you try to avoid Fridays and Saturday mornings when obtaining your photo I.D. To obtain an I.D. the following 3 requirements must be brought to the DOR.

1. Proof of Lawful Presence. (One of the following)

- U.S. Birth Certificate (certified with embossed or raised seal issued by state or local government)
- U.S. Passport (valid or expired)
- Certificate of Citizenship
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Certificate of Birth Abroad

2. Proof of Identity

- Provide Social Security Number, if one has been assigned or
- If a Social Security Number has not been assigned, the applicant must present a letter from the Social Security Administration regarding the status of the applicant's Social Security Number.

3. Proof of Residents (One of the following)

- Utility bill, most recent (phone, water, gas, electric, trash or sewer, etc.)
- Voter registration card, most recent.
- Bank statement, most recent
- Pay check, most recent
- Government check, most recent
- Property tax receipt, most recent
